Jung saw his psychological work as similar to that of the solitary alchemist, striving both to liberate spirit from matter and to imbue the inert matter with spirit, a cyclical process in which the transformative experience of individuation comes to life. In this course, Lara Newton and Jeff Raff, two senior analysts of the Jung Institute of Colorado will present and explore the psychological dimensions that alchemical imagery opens to us. We will share some general information and also look in depth at some of the themes and alchemists that we have found important in our own personal studies.
